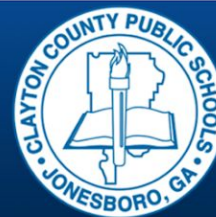

Board of Education to Hold Audio Only Virtual Meeting on March 30, 2020

Combined Work Session/Regular Meeting is Scheduled to Begin at 6 p.m.

JONESBORO – While Clayton County Public Schools (CCPS) remains closed due to the Coronavirus (COVID-19), the district’s leadership is focused on maintaining an effective organization that will be ready when a regular schedule for school returns. To that end, the Clayton County Board of Education will conduct a unified **Work Session/Board Meeting** on Monday, March 30, 2020, at 6 p.m. The combined meeting eliminates the need for the April 13 meeting that was on the official Board meeting schedule. The Board will not meet at the Administration Complex. Instead, the meeting will be held via telephone using conferencing technology.

District and community stakeholders will be able to follow the meeting by going to the district’s website at www.clayton.k12.ga.us and clicking on the Board Meeting graphic on the home page’s scrolling banner. This will connect stakeholders to the virtual meeting which will be audio only. Please note the agenda for the March 30 Work Session/Board Meeting will be available later this week.
